2024 BUDGET

• \$12 billion – a 19% increase over FY23

Including:

- \$5 billion for climate action
- \$1.8 billion for EJ initiatives and programs
- \$1.4 billion to improve air quality and reduce localized pollution, reduce exposure to radiation, and improve indoor air quality
- Addition of nearly 2,000 FTEs
